Context

CDFVR's primary purpose is to create and disseminate knowledge to influence, and enhance, policy, programs and practice in the field of domestic and family violence prevention across Queensland. We do this through research, professional development, education and community engagement activities pertaining to domestic and family violence.

CDFVR is highly committed to working collaboratively with government and community agencies across the state to ensure its work continues to be relevant to sector needs. This involves the establishment and maintenance of databases containing names, email addresses, phone numbers and postal addresses for various advisory and reference groups associated with CDFVR projects.

The Queensland Government has established a privacy regime for the Queensland public sector based on the 11 Information Privacy Principles set out in Commonwealth Privacy Legislation. These are contained in an Information Standard 42 that Queensland agencies are required to adhere to.
